3. MORE GARDÁÍ ON THE BEAT IN NEIGHBOURHOODS

Labour's commitment is to ensure that there are more Gardai on the beat in neighbourhoods. Hard working families are entitled to live in peaceful law-abiding communities. Labour is convinced that changes in the manning, deployment and organisation of the Garda Síochána would have a hugely positive impact on people's quality of life and on crime and anti-social behaviour.

4. ABOLISH THE MEANS TEST FOR CARERS

Labour's commitment is to abolish the means test for carers. Carers in our communities provide unpaid help for a family member or friend with a disability. And while nearly half of these carers have no paid employment and one third of them give more than 43 hours of unpaid time per week, less than a fifth receive financial assistance from the state for their invaluable

5. ENABLE MORE PEOPLE TO BEGIN TO BUY A HOME

The Labour Party has developed a new idea to help people get onto the property ladder. It is a new scheme that will provide a means for people with a job to begin to buy their own home. This new proposal is called 'Begin to Buy'.
