



Bus Cutbacks Devastate Commuters

The savage programme of cutbacks to Dublin Bus fleets and services being overseen by the Fianna Fail/Green government is a devastating blow for Dublin North East commuters according to Labour's Transport Spokesperson Tommy Broughan T.D.

The Dempsey/Fianna Fail/Greens programme of bus cutbacks will see 120 buses removed from the Dublin Bus fleet. "This savage reduction in the Dublin bus fleet means bus services being merged or even completely cancelled as well as reduced bus frequencies across the board," said Deputy Broughan. "Many Dublin North East commuters and workers have no public transport options apart from the buses", adds Cllr. Andrew Montague. Labour believes that the Dublin Bus and Bus Eireann fleets must be maintained and enhanced with attractive new fares, integrated ticketing, real time information and the Automatic Vehicle Location system.

Time for Taxi Reform

Tommy Broughan T.D. has backed a major overhaul of the taxi industry.

On behalf of Labour, Tommy has proposed a new fair system of taxi regulation and enforcement to achieve the highest quality service for passengers as well as providing a decent, liveable income for all taxi workers using rigorous entry, licensing and quality service standards. Labour believes a new long term market demand evaluation mechanism for regulating the taxi sector should be established and a moratorium on issuing licenses introduced while the new framework is put in place.

Graffiti Crisis as funding runs out

Tommy Broughan T.D. has slammed Environment Minister John Gormley and Community Minister Eamon O'Cuiv after learning that funding for key Dublin City Council graffiti removal programmes for 2009 has already run out.

"It's astonishing that a Green Environment Minister is in charge of this escalating plague of graffiti in our communities", said Deputy Broughan. "Now outstanding community groups such as the Belcamp Estate Steering Committee, Dublin 17 have been told that there is no more money available for their critical graffiti removal schemes."

Broughan and Coyle Raise School Cutbacks

Dublin North East Labour Deputy Tommy Broughan and Malahide/Portmarnock Cllr. Peter Coyle have raised the appalling cutbacks recently imposed on local schools by Education Minister Batt O'Keefe.

Cllr. Coyle said, "Schools across Dublin North East including St. Helen's Senior NS, Portmarnock are to lose teachers from September."

St. Paul's Junior National School Ayrfield, Dublin 13; Scoil Bhride, Donaghmede, Dublin 13; Scoil Aine, Raheny, Dublin 5; Naoiscoil Ide, Raheny Dublin 5; St. Fiachra's SNS, Beaumont, Montrose, Dublin 5; Darndale Junior National School, Malahide Road, Dublin 17; St. Francis Junior National School, Priorswood, Dublin 17; and St. Joseph's Junior National School, Bayside, Dublin 13 will also see their teaching staff cut even further this Autumn.

Cllr. Coyle and Deputy Broughan have also backed St. Helen's N.S., Portmarnock's outstanding campaign to retain their special mixed ability class.

Darndale Priorswood Regeneration Must Proceed

Tommy Broughan T.D. has asked Environment Minister John Gormley and City Manager John Tierney to reverse their outrageous decision to abandon the regeneration of part of Buttercup and Moatview/Belcamp Estates, Dublin 17.

Deputy Broughan said, "This is a critically important local development project given that the regeneration of the rest of Darndale Estate has long been completed. Deputy Broughan also deplored the failure of Dublin City Council to proceed with long proposed affordable housing schemes at infill sites in Belcamp and Moatview Estates in 2009."

Deputy Broughan said, "It is completely unacceptable that infill affordable housing schemes are now being placed in jeopardy given that large former amenity open spaces in Moatview and Belcamp have been left as semi-derelict sites for over three years."

Parsis, Santa Sabina, Sutton

Deputy Broughan and Cllr. Cian O'Callaghan are continuing to strongly support **Sutton** residents on a new planning application by **Parsis Ltd** at **Santa Sabina, Sutton**. The latest roposal is for 87 apartments in five 4 storey blocks and a terrace of 12 houses with 121 parking spaces.

Deputy Broughan has opposed a Meteor Microwave mast at Kilbarrack Shopping Centre.

Northside Town Centre

Northside Labour Deputy Tommy Broughan has said that many important density, height, traffic, environmental and other issues have not been addressed by An Bord Pleanala's decision to grant permission to the Northside Town Centre redevelopment.

The proposed new Northside Town Centre includes 1,340

apartment units and duplexes rising to eight storeys in height. There will also be a new Civic Plaza with a number of important community buildings.

"The permission granted by An Bord Plenala is for ten years. Northside residents are pleased that a much needed upgrade of Northside Shopping Centre is in sight. But many anxieties and concerns remain about the now approved development. The essential 8 storey height and "new town" high densities of the proposal remain.

The huge traffic volumes which will be generated by the new Town Centre may adversely affect existing and new residents and there are ongoing local worries about the security and future management of the proposed new Town Plaza. Deputy Broughan has also demanded that all local stakeholders and residents' representatives are fully involved in the construction phase and management of the vast new proposal.


Want to register to vote?
